

Funding Award for LACE

oughshore Access and Community Enterprise (LACE) has been awarded a Lottery grant to create a social enterprise that will help to breathe new life into the rural South Lough Neagh communities.

LACE is one of two groups in the Craigavon area that have been offered grants totalling nearly £99,000 from the Big Lottery Fund's Village SOS scheme which is supporting rural communities across the UK to come together to improve facilities, services and opportunities for local people.

The programme, which is now closed for applications, supports rural communities with less than 3,000 people to develop plans for enterprising projects from community run shops and pubs to energy or transport schemes, and craft or food projects. LACE plans to use its grant of £50,000 to set up a community handyman business offering a range of services to isolated people living in the South Lough Neagh area, which includes hamlets Derryinver, Derrytransa, Derryadd, Kinnego, Aghagallon, The Birches and Maghery.

LACE will employ local people, including those who are long term un-



employed, to visit people's homes in the area and carry out small tasks such as gardening, minor house repairs and decorating. As well as creating employment the business will give the older people the chance to chat and raise any worries or concerns they have.

"This is a deprived area where there are older people, people with disabilities and those with mental ill health who live alone and are quite isolated. They often don't get to see anyone from one week to the next and they can get quite lonely." said Chairman Alan Emerson.

The handyman scheme will help people with small jobs by offering reasonably priced skilled work. We hope to create training in handyman skills which may lead to employment for local people who are long term unemployed.

Tommy Glenny's Book Review THE GROUND WE STAND ON

By way of introduction I wish to say that local historian Thomas Glenny's new book 'The ground We Stand On' is a well researched history of north Co. Armagh and in its 250 pages this Birches author unfolds for us stories which start in the local townlands but spread to involve people far removed by geography and time.



In particular his tale of local born man Rob-

ert Hart who went on to modernize China in the nineteenth century gives an interesting insight into a man and his family connections while the scope of his achievements and respect in which he was held around the world are breathtaking. Who knew for instance that Norway presented him with the Grand Order of St. Olaf, or that he was honoured by Italy, Belgium, France Japan, Russia, China, Japan, Holland, Portugal, Austria, USA, The Vatican, not to mention the U.K.!

Thomas Glenny is well known as a modern day poet and he makes good use of verse and song from many ages past to illustrate and enliven the pages of this comprehensive book. He has a wonderful knowledge of shops and businesses in Portadown having worked there in times past. His stories are always entertaining recalling businesses and characters long gone.

The section entitled 'The Moss Men of The Birches' illustrates as to how important the peat industry once was to the local economy and he underscores his narrative with some humorous accounts associated with the now forgotten labour force. His research into the families who

laboured to extract peat from the bogs reveals tales of help, kindness, and generosity among those who had little to spare.

Liberally illustrated with eye catching photography overall the book is a compelling read not only for the local but for those interested in Irelands past, and without doubt will appeal wholeheartedly to the many exiles and their descendants, who once left this land to seek a life in the wider realm.

The Vikings Come to Maghery

The Vikings – The Return

aghery Country Park and Lough Neagh saw the 'invasion of the Vikings', when 2 longboats rowed by scores of Viking warriors did battle and bade farewell to one of their own on a blazing funeral pyre. There was no need to panic, though, as the events of the day were part of the first ever Viking Festival organised at Maghery Country Park by South Lough Neagh Regeneration Association and South Lough Neagh Historical Society. The hugely successful event – which drew massive crowds; both young and old, through the day – featured battle re-enactments, Viking villages and camps as well as displays of the various skills of the era.

Longboats sailed on the Lough, a sight which hasn't been witnessed in 1,200 years, and a grand Viking Banquet with music and stories finished the proceedings later in the evening.

Event committee member, Robert Greenaway said, "This event will further promote the uniqueness of the Lough Neagh area and create opportunities for local people to work together in harmony to create awareness of our shared cultural past.

The event was opened by Dungannon & South Tyrone Borough Council's Mayor, Mr Féilim Gildernew.

The Vikings Event received funding from OFMDFM, Craigavon Borough Council, Dungannon & South Tyrone Borough Council, the International Fund for Ireland, and the Department of Foreign Affairs, and supported by local businesses.





South Lough Neagh Regeneration Association teamed up with Rural Community Network to deliver three culture awareness programmes. The first was a visit to the Chinese centre in Belfast, the second visit was to the Indian Centre in Belfast and it finished of the visit to the Polish Society in Portadown. At each event approx. 35 rural women attended each event.

The purpose of this visit is in response to the need for opportunities to engage with BME communities in order to improve their understanding of different ethnic families living in the region, share learning and experiences, find common ground, and build friendship.

The Objectives of the study visit:

- 1. To broaden the opportunities for local women to interact with women from diverse ethnic back-grounds.
- 2. To enhance the understanding local women have of different cultures and experiences.
- 3. To foster links made with local women and BME groups locally and elsewhere
- 4. To promote dialogue on shared experiences and cultural identity
- 5. To support the integration of BME communities in the area through shared learning
- 6. To build social connections between the group members and other immigrant women living in the regions.

A cultural awareness workshop was held on each day. There were lively discussions on customs, family values, food, and crafts and to finish a delicious homemade meal from each centre.
